5.	<b>Heritage Crime and EAA 2023.</b>	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Chair</b> explained how the EAA are working on a much-needed pan EU law concerning Metal Detecting which should come into British Law as well. Both <b>Chair</b> and <b>MM</b> are involved in this work.</li> <li>It appears that the RIG committee is heavily involved. <b>Chair</b> is running a session and <b>CF</b>, <b>MM</b> and <b>JH</b> are giving papers at Belfast 2023 so we will make it known when advertising for the AGM and invite group members to say hello if there.</li> <li>There was a lengthy discussion on co-operation with the newly formed Heritage Crime Group SIG and it was decided on a Joint venture. It was decided that it should also include the International Practice group as well.</li> <li><b>Chair</b> to email <b>MK</b> with details to pass on to the Heritage Crime and International Practice groups to see if they wish to collaborate on a session or workshop on this matter.</li> </ul>	<p><b>EG</b></p>
6.	<b>ChatGPT</b>	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The discussion on this started with an explanation that this came from a discussion being held by AEA (Association of Environmental Archaeologists), and comments by some professors about the ethics of using ChatGPT for papers. It was generally felt that if it was being used as a personal tool there was no problem. <b>Chair</b> pointed out that in her experience you could spot a ChatGPT piece of work due to lack of citations so not a good tool for scholarship. It also brought into the discussion Plagiarism. It was felt that while an eye needs to be kept on it, as a personal tool it was OK.</li> </ul>	
7.	<b>Archaeological Lab H&amp;S and Risk assessment</b>	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>CF</b> informed the committee that he had presented a discussion paper to archeobotanist working group of the AEA. Most commercial environmental archaeologists claimed their company was very good, and that there were procedures were adequate to deal with harmful materials, academics were less sure. <b>CF</b> expressed scepticism that all was rosy in the garden especially in the field.</li> </ul>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There then followed a wide-ranging discussion on many aspects of H&amp;S especially in the field, where consensus was that Archaeology was operating far behind modern construction practices and standards.</li> <li>• <b>Chair</b> explained that she was a rep in the Prospect union and had made use of a free 10 week training course provided by the TUC to all union members, and bemoaned that none of the other Prospect archaeological reps were not also H&amp;S trained especially as the course was an enlightening one that highlighted how behind the times archaeology was.</li> <li>• <b>Chair</b> asked <b>CF</b> to write up a report and circulate to the committee for next meeting.</li> </ul>	<b>CF</b>
