Group communication

Other pieces of work

We conducted a member survey and this year we have been analysing the results of this. The Archaeological Archives Group Committee have been involved in several projects over the year, including advice and consultation.

For example

- In early 2024 the AAG committee consulted on and gave feedback on the Transfer of Title Toolkit and Model Contract.
- In late 2024 the AAG committee reviewed the Archives Specialist Competence matrix and suggested a number of additions and edits.
- more recently members of the group have been compiling and analysing the AAG
 Group survey results. This has taken longer than anticipated due to other priorities and
 full schedules. It is hoped that the results will be ready to present at the day conference
 in September 2025.

Plans for the next year

Our next day conference 'From Past to Future: Archiving 2000–2025' will be held on Thursday 25 September 2025 at The Archaeological Resource Centre (The ARC), Northamptonshire. The theme for this year's archaeological archives conference will include look backwards at archive's past, so that we may look forward into its future. We will discuss how the current archaeological archiving practices reflect the changes, challenges, progress and transformation of the sector since the millennium.

In line with the results of our group survey, over the next year the AAG committee hope to engage with CIfA's Knowledge Hub (an online Q&A) and begin to run a series of online tea breaks focused on back-to-basics practical archive training. Sessions may include themes such as packing bulk finds, packing small finds and packing paperwork.

We will also be adding external links to relevant archive standards and guidelines to our webpage to make this accessible.

Committee meetings and AGM

The EC SIG Committee holds meetings every two months or so to discuss current progress in event planning, communications with CIfA, upcoming CPD opportunities, as well as social media and links to other SIGs or organisations.

Meetings are attended by committee members and occasionally advisors. They provide a valuable opportunity to plan, discuss, and facilitate ideas for the group and the year ahead. These meetings are in addition to those attended by Katie Sanderson in her role on the Board of Directors and Theo Seddon, in his role on the Advisory Council.

For accessibility and efficiency, meetings continue to be held online. They take place around 7 pm and typically last about an hour, depending on the agenda. Any additional discussion takes place via the SIG's WhatsApp channels. Smaller sub-group meetings are also arranged as needed, particularly when collaborating with other SIGs or organisations, or when focusing on specific tasks and projects.

In November 2024, an in-person committee day was hosted at the York office of the Council for British Archaeology (CBA). The day included an in-person meeting as well as a meet-and-greet dinner for new and existing committee members.

The committee hosted their annual AGM in April 2025. A new committee was successfully voted in. A post AGM lecture entitled 'Seeing Red: A Gender Inclusive Menstruation Scheme' was delivered by Amy Talbot. Talk by Amy Talbot about the revival of Seeing Red - 23 April 2025

Activities and events

September 2024: The EC SIG supported the campaign and election of Katie Sanderson as an ordinary member for the CIfA Board of Directors. Katie was duly elected as a member, an incredible achievement and an important recognition of EC at a senior level.

The EC SIG collaborated/supported the Finds SIG at their AGM Conference event as early career panellists for discussion.

November 2024: The EC SIG committee conducted an in person meeting at the York office of the CBA. The day included an in person meeting as well as a meet and greet dinner for new and old committee members.

December 2024: Mike (Advisor and Former Chair of AC) and Sakshi (former Chair of EC SIG) produced the CIfA Salary Benchmarking report with core CIfA Staff, Prospect and BAJR. The EC SIG committee collaborated on the production and testing of a survey for the second and larger phase.

January/February 2025: The EC SIG made the decision to quit X (Twitter) and join Bluesky instead.

The existing definition of 'Early Careers' was updated.

A new social media policy was created.

January 2025: Virtual planning took place for a 2025 shared event between the EC SIG and the Project Management SIG for our members. Potential ideas include leadership tips, report writing and advice for project management.

March 2025: An in-person employability and discussion about ClfA was delivered by Sakshi (former chair), Mike (current advisor) and Tabby (former secretary) to undergraduate students at UCL, London.

April 2025: The EC SIG Committee, as well as several members attended CIfA's Annual Conference and fringe event in Birmingham (both in a speaking and organisation capacity). Rosie and Sakshi (former chair) both contributed to insightful talks/debates.

The committee successfully hosted another AGM and a new committee was successfully voted in. A post AGM lecture entitled 'Seeing Red: A Gender Inclusive Menstruation Scheme' was delivered by Amy Talbot.

July 2025: The EC SIG co-organised and supported the annual Early Careers Conference with the Council for British Archaeology (CBA), during the Festival of Archaeology.

Group communication

We have a growing following on all social media platforms which we use to direct members to relevant training, conferences and articles. Social media engagement has increased our outreach to early careers individuals, although we understand that these followers are not solely made of EC SIG paid members. Our social media posts include polls and surveys which encourage engagement and help to ensure that members' voices are heard. All further plans are in the early stages of development but include

- collaborating with CIfA on accredited degree courses, including exploring how our network could contribute to discussions with the wider membership and helping CIfA better understand the needs of prospective students
- collaborating with PMSIG who are working on a document for CifA outlining pathways and the skills required to achieve membership
- promoting and collaborating with Historic England on their mentoring scheme
- EC SIG Committee representation on a panel within a CBA 'This is Archaeology' lecture which will focus on various aspects of archaeology from an early career's perspective
