Travel & accommodation

Canterbury has two train stations: East and West. Both stations are within walking distance from CCCU campus (30 minute walk). We recommend the Southeastern Train High Speed train link from London St Pancras, which arrives at Station West.

Parking *may* be available on campus (entrance at Old Sessions House on Longport Road) but drivers are advised to explore off-campus parking options in advance.

Canterbury is a busy tourist city in the summer months – make sure to book accommodation, if required, well in advance.
